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Introduction

Although the chances of weapons attack are low, the risk still exists. It is important that we are all ready to respond quickly and safely if an attack happens.

In an attack, the three words you need to remember are **ESCAPE. HIDE. TELL.**

- **ESCAPE** – move away from danger as quickly and quietly as possible and encourage others to do the same, but only if it's safe to do so.
- If you can't escape, **HIDE** – stay out of sight and silence your phone.
- **TELL** – contact Emergency Services by calling Triple Zero (000) when it is safe.

Background

The **ESCAPE. HIDE. TELL.** message informs the community and business about what to do in the unlikely event of a weapons attack or other similar attack.

We must do everything we can to protect crowded places and make sure everyone knows the safest actions to take.

Remembering these three actions will support you and those around you to stay safe.

While the advice will help everyone be prepared for an incident, it does not mean we are expecting one.

ESCAPE. HIDE. TELL. is important—because in an attack, what you do matters.

Key messages

- The chance of a weapons attack is low, but it's important to know what to do.
- If there is an attack, how you respond matters and can keep you safe.
- The three words to remember are **ESCAPE. HIDE. TELL.**
- Attacks can involve explosions, vehicles or chemical and other weapons.
